Hope Over Fear by Anil Shrivastava 'Musafir'



I was diagnosed having ulcerative colitis in 1995. Despite diet control and medicines including occasional use of

steroids, I kept on bleeding, sometimes profusely resulting in a severe weight loss. God granted me the serenity to accept the things I couldn't change. But my condition started worsening. Many of my friends and acquaintances started showing concerns over my deteriorating health. I never revealed having ulcerative colitis to either my friends or my employer. I decided to choose hope over desperation, fight over flight. I got the entire colon removed and a J-pouch built from my own body tissues in place of the colon. That was in 2004.

After a few years, the J-pouch started malfunctioning giving me incessant cramps, stomach aches, diarrhea and urgency to go. Doctors told me that there was no way out except replacing the inner pouch (j-pouch) with ileostomy (wearing an external pouch through my stomach). I had to decide between living with the present condition confined in home or go for ileostomy. I still kept working and socializing with constant fear and insecurity of losing control. After all, "When God gives you lemons, take a bow." (Dale Carnegie).

On October 5, 2019 my original surgeon at Cleveland Clinic took a chance. She opened me and found that the J-pouch she had created was choking under massive scar tissues that I had developed in my stomach over the years. Fortunately, she was able to correct the problem. Consequently, I got rid of unyielding misery and sinking feelings. I got a new life.

The purpose of the above story is not singing the blues. I am not trying to declare valiance of any kind either. I simply realized that I had now the capability to make an effort towards accomplishing many things. I don't believe in the saying, "You can accomplish anything, if you have life and health," but we, certainly, can make an effort to achieve anything.

We become quite adaptable to any condition when we are forced into a do or die situation. I came across many people around me struggling and going through more intense situation than mine. Their courage gave me something to aspire to, something to emulate.

During the many tedious hospital visits that were part of my life, I came across hundreds of people with afflictions worse than mine, young patients going through painful therapies, patients too weak living with bouts of pain. Many had spent much more time in the dreaded hallways of hospitals than I did. Their struggles opened my eyes.

I now have the ability to maintain a daily routine, learn new languages, and acquire knowledge about new technologies. And a chance that I will maintain my health removes that gut-wrenching feeling in me (no pun intended).

I'll leave you with the lines of Longfellow to ponder:

Life is real! Life is earnest!
And the grave is not its goal; ...
Let us, then, be up and doing,
With a heart for any fate;
Still achieving, still pursuing,
Learn to labor and to wait.

So We Want To Impeach Mr. Trump

We all know that the Democrats started working on Mr. Trump's impeachment right after the latter took the oath of office in January 2017. Many key Democrats couldn't accept Mrs. Clinton's defeat in the hands of President Trump. Rep. Maxine Waters was one of the first Democrats to call for Mr. Trumps' impeachment. She said this in 2017, "Why would we let somebody like Trump, a con man, come in here and turn it all upside down with his lies and his disrespect? And so, I personally feel very strongly about this and I'm going to keep working until he's impeached."

Our congressmen/women and Senators were elected by their constituents to work on critical issues facing the nation such as healthcare, immigration (including DACA), education, environment, budget caps, infrastructure, social welfare reform, new NAFTA just to name a few. I am sorry to report that our Congress has accomplished none of those.

Talking of Mr. Trump, many of his wounds are self-inflicted. He has added fuel to the fire facilitating his own impeachment. Here are some examples:

- ·1. He has demanded that public officials put their loyalty to him ahead of their duty to the public
- ·2. He encouraged the department of Justice Launch criminal probes into his critics and political adversaries
- ·3. As Mike Bloomberg put it recently, Mr. Trump is tweeting more and leading less
- \cdot 4. He doesn't trust his advisors; interferes in their work to make them ineffective. In turn they become his enemies
- ·5. He lacks the tact to work with opposition. (However, in his case the opposition refused to accept him as a legitimate president to begin with.)
- · 6. Many of Mr. Trump's actions seem autocratic not democratic
- \cdot 7. He withheld military aid from Ukraine until they (Ukraine) agreed to investigate some business dealings of Burisma involving VP Biden's son, Hunter Biden (a quid pro quo)

Of all the examples above, the Democrats think that Ukraine issue is an impeachable offence. The House of Representatives' Leader, Ms. Pelosi took this accusation to the level of bribery. No one knows, for sure, whether allegations against Mr. Trump are impeachable charges or not. Representative Adam Schiff, whose committee is leading the inquiry will prepare formal charges against the president and will put that for an up and down vote on the floor of the House. Since Democrats have a 36-seat majority in the House of Representatives, it's very likely that President Trump will be impeached, but most likely he will be acquitted of all charges by the Senate.



What Will Happen if President Trump Is Impeached?

That will be very interesting to watch because never in the history of the **United States** of America an impeached president has run for the White House again. Out of the two presidents ever impeached by the Congress,

Andrew Johnson was denied nomination by the Democratic Party for the 1868 presidential election. He later became a Senator from Tennessee in 1875.

President Bill Clinton was impeached in 1998 during his second term. So, he couldn't have run for the office of the president, anyway. Interestingly, Andrew Johnson was acquitted in the Senate by just one vote and all the Senators who voted for his acquittal lost in the following elections.

Bill Clinton was acquitted in Senate by 10 votes.

In the aftermath of Mr. Trump's impeachment there are two possibilities on the horizon. First, Because Mr. Trump's offense was not compelling, overwhelmingly clear, and unambiguous and because people are tired of inaction of the legislative branch, his base will be energized behind him. Many independents and moderate Democrats will vote for Mr. Trump and other Republicans. Trump will be re-elected and the Republicans may recapture the House.

Secondly, many voters who supported Mr. Trump may not like to cast their votes for an impeached president. They may also express their anger against the Senators who would vote for Mr. Trump's acquittal repeating the scenario that followed President Andrew Johnson's acquittal in the Senate.

Whatever, the outcome, the do-nothing Democrats (and Republicans) have clearly engaged in a purely partisan project. In reality those Democrats (especially in red states and swing districts) are worried about the inquiry's effects not only on their own reelection chances, but also on the balance of power in Washington.

Unfortunately, public and media don't like to hear or speak truth either. As most of us are not independent thinkers, we like to hear only the stories that fit our preconceived notions. The most vulnerable are those who have put some kind of label on themselves. Thus, their labels guide them to action instead of their faculty.

We have found Bill Clinton, Richard Nixon, Dick Cheney, Nancy Pelosi, Eric Holder, Donald Trump, Rudy Giuliani, Hillary Clinton and everyone else caught in a web of lies. The worst thing is that all of them support their untruthfulness with passion. Statements like, "I did not have sexual relations with that woman, (Bill Clinton)" "Read my lips-no new taxes (George H W Bush)," "I am not a crook, (Richard

Nixon)," "If you like your health care plan, you can keep it (Barack Obama)' still haunt our ears.

Lying, deception and distortion are not the traits of the present-day politicians only. Let's look at history. Lyndon B. Johnson, who repeatedly promised during

the 1964 presidential campaign, "We are not about to send American boys 9 or 10 thousand miles away from home to do what Asian boys ought to be doing for themselves." At the very same time and with Johnson's approval, the Pentagon was drawing up plans to send the first wave of more than 100,000 American servicemen to Vietnam.

The election campaign between presidential candidates John Quincy Adams and Andrew Jackson was nasty and bitter and involved extreme lies and accusations. Adams' campaign said Jackson was an adulterer for having a relationship with a married woman (his own wife). And they said Rachel (Andrew Jackson's wife) was a bigamist for having two husbands and thus she was declared an adulterer too. Jackson believed that those attacks had hastened his wife's death.

Campaign war between Thomas Jefferson and his VP Aron Burr got down-and-dirty. The campaign of 1800 between the two is supposed to be the nastiest in the history of presidential elections. This was the only election in history where a vice president had run against the president he was currently serving under. Jefferson hired a writer to pen insults rather than dirty his own hands. One of his nasty lines said that Adams was a "hideous hermaphroditical character which has neither the force nor firmness of a man, nor the gentleness and sensibility of a woman."

Considering that our elected politicians are our own reflection, we shouldn't blame them wholly for their dishonesties. Just think of all the small, petty untruths we engage in our daily lives. When we are asked a very basic question like how old we are, a lie is often used in lieu of the truth. We also tell a lie to avoid conflict or avoid hurting someone's feelings. For example, when we know we are inconvenienced when someone asks for our help, we are often not honest with our answers, saying instead that we will be happy to help even when we know very well this isn't true; or we even make up a story based on a falsehood to get out of the situation.

We don't speak the truth because we don't want to hurt or offend the other person. When someone confronts us for derogatory statements, we often respond by saying: "I didn't quite say that," or "You didn't understand me." We lie on income- tax and expense accounts. We often engage ourselves in one-upmanship to impress others by making false stories about expensive vacations or about our heritage. We, very often, do not regard these lies as a serious offences because for us they are actually quite harmless. In fact, we are often led to believe that engaging in these kinds of lies actually benefits us. Our politicians being personification of the time we live in (past, present and future) indulge in coverup lies, conspiratorial lies and so on. So, if we need honest politicians, we need to change ourselves first.

This widespread cultural acceptance of lying is one of the main reasons why we don't have honest politicians. The very categories of truth versus falsehood, facts versus lies seem to have been obliterated. Consequently, the possibility of lying has become boundless and are met with little or no resistance when we lie. Therefore, lies,

deceptions and distortions have become mandatory in politics all over the world. First step we should take against this is rid ourselves of any kind of labeling and start thinking independently.



"Does he protect horses?"



Capitalism in America is an excellent book for everyone who wants to understand the reasons for American economic might and what causes economic ups and downs with a historical perspective. The authors, a past Federal Reserve chairman, Alan

Greenspan and an economist, Adrian Wooldridge also consider whether America will retain its economic superiority or will fade into mediocracy.

The most important reasons for America's unprecedented economic superiority, according to the authors, are innovation, creative destruction and encouragement provided to the entrepreneurs.

Creative destruction is described as the dismantling of long-standing practices in order to make way for innovation. Creative destruction was first coined by Austrian economist Joseph Schumpeter in 1942. Thus, creative destruction is also called Schumpeterian process

The authors give credit for America's economic growth to Laissez-faire. Further on, the authors suggest that entitlements reform and more pragmatic reserves ratios at big banks are essential to maintaining our economic superiority.

Entitlement reform is making changes in government programs such as Social Security and Medicare so that they are less expensive. Cash Reserve Ratio is the percentage of deposits which commercial banks are required to keep as cash.


Capitalism in America is a must read for a clear understanding of capitalism vis-à-vis democracy.

I came across Women Who Hate Other Women by Heather Hodsden while browsing Linkedin.com. The introduction of this book states, "My goal is to shed light on the problems they (women) face and to tell women's workplace horror stories." This subject, which is extremely close to my heart, has been overlooked, ignored, and ill-addressed."..." The goal of this book is to let other women who have been verbally assaulted, fired for no reason of their own, and gossiped about by another female coworker know that they aren't alone."

The book's Chapter One starts with Heather's own experience at Sayreville War Memorial High School where she was employed as a French language teacher. There she was bullied, ostracized and humiliated by none other than her female co-workers. To add insult to injury, the school administration fired her at the end of the 2003 school year without taking any steps to act on Heather's complaints. The other teachers were jealous of her superior pedagogy. Later, a male teacher gave her the shocking news that her own mentor (a female) felt insecure due to her (Heather's) teaching abilities.

Heather suggests that women should fight against this malaise. She reveals that "The "history" of women in the workplace is to pretend that "hating" doesn't exist." She gives facts and figures about women's abuses at the workplace and provides the needed suggestions about the remedies and resources to get help.

The book is easy to read and very interesting. The problem is that the book's title and the first chapter, "Sayreville- My Story" gives the impression that Women Who Hate Other Women may just be a sob story. In fact, it's not so.

What are the Unhealthy Foods That We Are Eating? By Niru Prasad, MD



Organic versus non-organic fruits Some non-organic fruits and vegetables are contaminated with pesticides such as atrazine, a weed killer that causes serious health issues, especially for pregnant women.



Farmed Salmon Harvested salmon are fed an unnatural diet, and are contaminated with antibiotics, pesticides, chemicals and other carcinogens.

Additionally, they are low in omega-3 fatty acids, and contain higher levels of mercury. Hence it is better to buy canned salmon or wild sock-eye salmon when available.



Processed meats Processed meats such as sausages, bacon, bologna, and hot dogs all contain excess salt, chemicals, preservatives, and sodium nitrates which could be carcinogenic. The smoke involved in smoking meats and fish contain a significant amount of tar, which is also carcinogenic.

Highly processed white bleached flour is exposed to chlorine, which is not good for intestinal digestion. Instead, use refined grains which do not use chlorine in the manufacturing process.

"Young Women as Role Models"

I live in a state where our governor is a young woman, Gretchen Whitmer. Our representative in Washington is another young woman, Elissa Slotkin. Born in 1985, she had a chaotic childhood moving often from place to place as she came from a low-income family. Politics seemed out of reach for her. She moved up from ranks of her political party to the top job helped by her extraordinary and proven organizational skills. Rather than focusing attention on herself, Ms. Marin only talks about issues at hand. Speaking to reporters shortly after being sworn in earlier this month (December 2019), Ms. Marin avoided questions about herself saying, "She was focused on governing."

New Zealand's current PM, Ms. Jacina Ardern also is a breath of fresh air for the Kiwis. She was elected in 2017. By the way, New Zealand was the first country to grant women the right to vote in parliamentary elections in 1893. Despite being the Prime Minister Ms. Arden leads a very ordinary life. Ms. Arden had to face nasty terror attacks in two mosques in Christchurch, a city in New Zealand. She showed her strength in calming the nation with a forceful speech and compassion for the victims. When **Donald Trump** made a condolence call and asked what support the U.S. could offer, she told him, "Sympathy and love for the victims."

"Mercury's Visit – What's the Fuss?"

A very significant celestial event took place in our own solar system on November 11, 2019. The planet Mercury crossed the disc of the Sun on that day.

In laymen's term, the planet Mercury came directly through the path between the Earth and Sun. So what's the fuss about it? After all, this event will happen again in the year 2032. (By



the way, planets Mercury, Venus and Earth are the nearest planets from the Sun in that order).

These celestial events are significant because of a couple of reasons. First, this is only during these transits when we can view Mercury in the sky. Secondly, these events help determine the distance of our Earth from the Sun. It's true that we already know those distances, but they are still approximations to some extent. Every time these transits happen, interplanetary distances are further finetuned. Also, once any one distance gets known, it becomes easier to tell the distance of other planets from the Sun.

Fine tuning of the distances between the Sun and other planets is very important. Cassini and his fellow scientists determined the distance between Earth

and Sun at 87 million miles. Now the same distance is readjusted as 93 million miles. We owe these accuracies to these transits. Scientists measure those

distances by observing the transits from different points on earth. The distance between the points of observations combined with the transit time of the planet in front of the

Sun permits accurate calculation of the distance of the planet Earth from the Sun. (You may do your own research to find out the math behind this). A similar method used in 1771 determined the distance between Earth and the Sun to be 95 million miles. (Now this is adjusted to 93 million miles).

More significantly, in the future, the distance between the Sun and its planets will keep on increasing because our Sun is constantly losing energy and hence it's mass, which allows the planets to move to larger orbits. This is not a good news for us earthlings, but we'll keep on refining interplanetary distances through these transits as long as we'll walk on the terra firma.
